

Sixth Form Dress Code

The Sixth Form Dress Code has been developed to allow students to dress in a similar manner to staff at St Benet Biscop. Restrictions on colour and patterns have been relaxed, although we would request that you do not wear neon colours or animal print.

As with staff, all students are expected to dress in a smart business-like manner. Student appearance should reflect the professional environment they work in.

- No large logos or graphics
- No denim
- No hoodies
- No animal print
- No neon
- No sportswear

Shirt/Top/Jumper	With sleeves and not see-through, no t-shirts/sweatshirts
Tie/Blazer/Suit Jacket	Optional
Trousers/Skirt/Dress	Smart suit style, skirts must be knee length, no jeans
Footwear	Smart formal shoes, no trainers or sports shoes
Piercings	Earrings and a discreet nose stud are allowed
Tattoos	Any tattoos should be covered at all times
Hair Colour	Should be within the natural range of hair colour
Jacket/Coat	Should be removed in lessons

The following items are deemed as unacceptable:

- Leisure or sportswear (except for PE or sports events)
- Denim jeans/skirts/jackets or jean styled trousers of any colour
- Trainers (except for PE) – This includes Converse/Vans
- Cropped tops, halter neck, low cut tops or dresses
- Visible underwear
- Skirts/shorts above the knee
- Clothing with slogans or brand names that may cause offence
- Flip flops, sandals, UGG boots
- Leggings or shorts
- Visible body piercings (other than earrings and a discrete nose stud)
- Tattoos (must be covered)
- Casual t-shirts/sweatshirts
- Tops/dresses with spaghetti straps
