

- Multiple events across Y12 and Y13
- Free to attend no costs attached

- Support and guidance from staff and students at Durham



What events will I attend?



Welcome Webinar Summer Series

- Fully online offer, outside of school time
- Introduction to the programme
- Clear guidelines on what we'll expect of you, and how to pass the programme
- Information, advice and guidance in the build up to the residential to boost academic and interpersonal skills
- Meet Durham staff and student ambassadors to help you feel prepared before the residential.

Summer Residential (Y12/ 2024)

- A five-day residential during the summer holidays
- Stay in one of our Durham colleges and learn about higher education and life at Durham
- We'll run a varied academic and social programme for you, reflective of actual university experience
- Sessions designed to help you feel comfortable and supported
- Mentor group with one of our student ambassadors
- Feedback on your academic work at a university level







Autumn Webinar Series

- Fully online offer, after the summer residential
- Three online sessions from Sept-Nov
- Information, advice and guidance to support you during the application phase
- Topics such as personal statement writing, student finance and choosing a Durham college

Spring Residential (Y13/ 2025)

- Residential in Spring of year 13
- Return to Durham and stay in one of our colleges
- Participate in a varied academic and social programme
- Mentor group with one of our student
 ambassadors
- Increase your confidence in making the jump from school/college to university







What will I get from SP?

- Confidence in yourself and your ability to succeed
- Development of personal skills that will help you throughout your lives
- A chance to find out if university life and Durham is for you
- Join a network of SP alumni and make new friends from a range of backgrounds
- Guaranteed, conditional & contextual offer; e.g. a usual offer asking for AAA would become ABB through SP, typically
- Support across Year 12 and Year 13

Eligibility Criteria

Be in Year 12

Be attending a state school or college within the North East, North West, or Yorkshire

Be taking subjects in relation to the subject strand you are applying for Come from a low participation or socio-economically disadvantaged neighborhood

Have achieved at least eight GCSEs or equivalent at grade 6 or above and have a strong level of achievement for relevant subjects

Care-experienced or estranged

Additional Criteria

Have experienced educational disruption

In receipt of, or entitled to, Free School Meals

Will be within the First Generation in their family to attend university

Attend schools or college with a low GCSE or A-Level attainment level
