













10 Ways Teachers Help Me Learn at St Benet Biscop



	Bell Tasks to Begin	<i>Bell tasks and starters help us to make a clear and quick start to lessons. Lessons start with retrieval tasks to help us remember more.</i>
	Excellent Explanations	<i>Our teachers explain things clearly and carefully, so that we can learn more.</i>
	Cold Call Questioning	<i>Our teachers ask us questions so that we learn more. Teachers ask questions so they can see what I know and understand.</i>
	Sequencing to Build Knowledge	<i>New knowledge is taught in chunks that build up over time. Over time, I use this knowledge so I can do more.</i>
	Modelling: What Brilliant Looks Like	<i>My teacher models what excellent work looks like. This helps me see what I am aiming for.</i>
	We Read to Succeed	<i>We read regularly so that we know more, learn more and can make progress in all of our subjects.</i>
	I say, You Say	<i>When we are taught new words, our teacher shows us how to say the word so we can recognise it and say it ourselves when we read it.</i>
	Go Solo: We Get to Apply What We Know	<i>We get time in lesson to work independently, so that we can apply what we have been taught and firm-up our understanding.</i>
	Feedback Loop	<i>We get regular feedback so we know how to improve. We get to respond to the teacher's feedback to show we've understood.</i>
