Westward Expansion - Texas became part of the USA in 1845 and when the USA won new territories in Oregon in 1846 and the West from Mexico in 1848 the Indian Frontier sat in the middle of the USA. The US government wanted US citizens to move to its new territories in the West. This meant that there was a change in US policy and that it was no longer the case that whites could

not cross the Frontier.
