Attendance matters, moments count

Punctuality. In each class the teacher takes a register. The attendance register is taken twice a day. If your child is late for school after the register has been closed your child is marked as late after registration. The Local Authority recognise this as an absent mark. Sustained lateness can result in prosecution, so we ask parents who are having difficulty with morning routines to speak to the attendance team as soon as possible for support from school.

Theme of the week

This week, we have been focusing on inspirational people - individuals who have demonstrated the values we hold as a school. As we learnt about them, we also reflected on how we can bring these qualities into our daily lives, whether in our studies, friendships, or challenges we face. We took this week as an opportunity to be inspired and to think about how we can grow into people who make a difference, just like those we admire.

Flame Event

On the 15th of March, we had the incredible opportunity to attend the CYMFED Flame event at Wembley, London, where we took 30 students to experience an unforgettable day. The theme of the event was centred around reminding students that they are "unstoppable," while also helping them find and strengthen their faith. It truly lived up to both of these powerful messages. We were fortunate enough to hear inspiring talks from renowned speakers such as Bear Grylls, David Wells, and Isaac Harvey MBE, whose words filled us with motivation, faith, and energy. The atmosphere was electrified by live music from Guvna B and Adenike, with students jumping up and down, fully immersed in the music.



One of the highlights was a powerful liturgy led by Cardinal Vincent Nichols, which brought us all together in prayer and reflection. With 10,000 young people in attendance, it was the largest Catholic event in the UK, creating an incredible sense of unity and excitement. Our students were exceptionally well-behaved and respectful, while also having an amazing time. One of our Year 8 students shared, *"The Flame event was the best day ever! I felt so inspired and part of something bigger than myself. I'm definitely unstoppable now!"* It was truly a day to remember, where students not only found joy but also a deeper connection to their faith.

CAFOD cake sale

Last week, 9I form class organized a fantastic cake sale in support of CAFOD as part of our Lenten challenge to raise at least £10 per form class. The students worked together, baking delicious cakes and designing eye-catching posters to promote the sale. 

EPQ (Extended Project Qualification)

We have had a number of Year 13 students studying the EPQ this academic year, where they have devised their own project title. Last week this culminated in students presenting their project journey to an audience, where there was a live Q&A session as part of the presentation. During the course of the year, students have really demonstrated that they are resilient and disciplined learners where they have had to independently research their chosen topic. Among the titles were 'What influences have had the most significance on the cosmetic dentistry market in the UK?', 'Is there a biological difference in education', 'LGBTQ+ representation in South Korean Film and TV' as well as an artefact 'A silent horror film'. It has been incredibly rewarding to see students develop the necessary skills ready for life beyond sixth form.
