Attendance matters, moments count

Punctuality. In each class the teacher takes a register. The attendance register is taken twice a day. If your child is late for school after the register has been closed your child is marked as late after registration. The Local Authority recognise this as an absent mark. Sustained lateness can result in prosecution, so we ask parents who are having difficulty with morning routines to speak to the attendance team as soon as possible for support from school.


Faith

Theme of the week

This week, we have focussed on the theme of empathy, which is the ability to understand and share the feelings of others. Empathy allows us to connect with people on a deeper level, fostering compassion and kindness in our relationships. In the Bible, empathy is reflected in the teachings of Jesus, who consistently showed care for those suffering, whether through healing, comforting, or offering support. Verses like Romans 12:15, "Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn," remind us that we are called to live in harmony with others, sharing in both their joys and struggles. Empathy is a powerful way to embody Christ's love and build stronger, more caring communities.

Port chaplain visits Year 12

Steve Willows, the regional port chaplain for Stella Maris, visited Year 12 during their core RE lecture to talk about his role with the world's largest ship-visiting network and the official maritime charity of the Catholic Church. Stella Maris supports seafarers who spend 9-12 months away from home, providing a 'friend in every port' and standing up for their rights. Steve shared the challenges seafarers face, including loneliness, depression, spiritual deprivation, and exploitation. Chaplains and volunteers visit hundreds of thousands of seafarers yearly, offering practical help, Mass on ships, and Wi-Fi to connect with family. Inspired by Steve's talk, Year 12 wrote letters of hope to the seafarers he meets, offering support and encouragement.









Pope John Paul II Award

Armani Carroll and Eve Murphy both achieved their Silver Pope John Paul II Award for their exceptional commitment to volunteering. They spent countless hours helping others, including litter picking, peer mentoring, leading dance and drama classes, tutoring students, serving teas and coffees, and raising money for charity. Their efforts within school and in their local parish were truly inspiring. Armani attended the award ceremony at the Hilton Hotel with our school chaplain and head of RE, where she had the special opportunity to meet the bishop and keynote speaker, Melany Francisco-Lawless.

Safer Internet Day 2025

This week, as part of Safer Internet Day 2025, our Key Stage 3 students have been engaging in important lessons focused on staying safe from online scammers. Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety, and each year, the event tackles a theme that is relevant to young peoples' experiences online. This year the theme is focused on scams, helping students understand how to protect themselves and others from the growing threats they may encounter in the digital world.

What Have Students Learned?

In their IT lessons, students have been exploring the risks of online scams, including phishing attacks, fake websites, and deceptive social media messages. They've discussed how scammers use various tactics to trick individuals into sharing personal information, and they've learned practical strategies to stay safe, such as recognising suspicious links, verifying the authenticity of messages, and reporting scams to trusted adults.

Snapchat



Year 8 Students: Exploring Career Pathways in the NHS

Last week, Year 8 students took part in an engaging and informative session about career opportunities within the NHS. The presentation provided a fun introduction to the wide range of pathways available post-16 and 18, including both clinical and non-clinical roles within healthcare.

The 1-hour session was designed to:

- Increase awareness of diverse careers in the NHS, including both clinical and non-clinical roles.
- Inspire and motivate students to consider a career in healthcare by raising their aspirations.
- Equip students with the knowledge of where to find information, advice, and guidance on healthcare careers.
- Emphasise the NHS values and the importance of patient care.
- Overcome socio-economic and cultural barriers to career progression.
- Strengthen pathways into vocational healthcare courses.
- Highlight various post-16 routes, showing how different learning styles can lead to fulfilling careers in the NHS.
