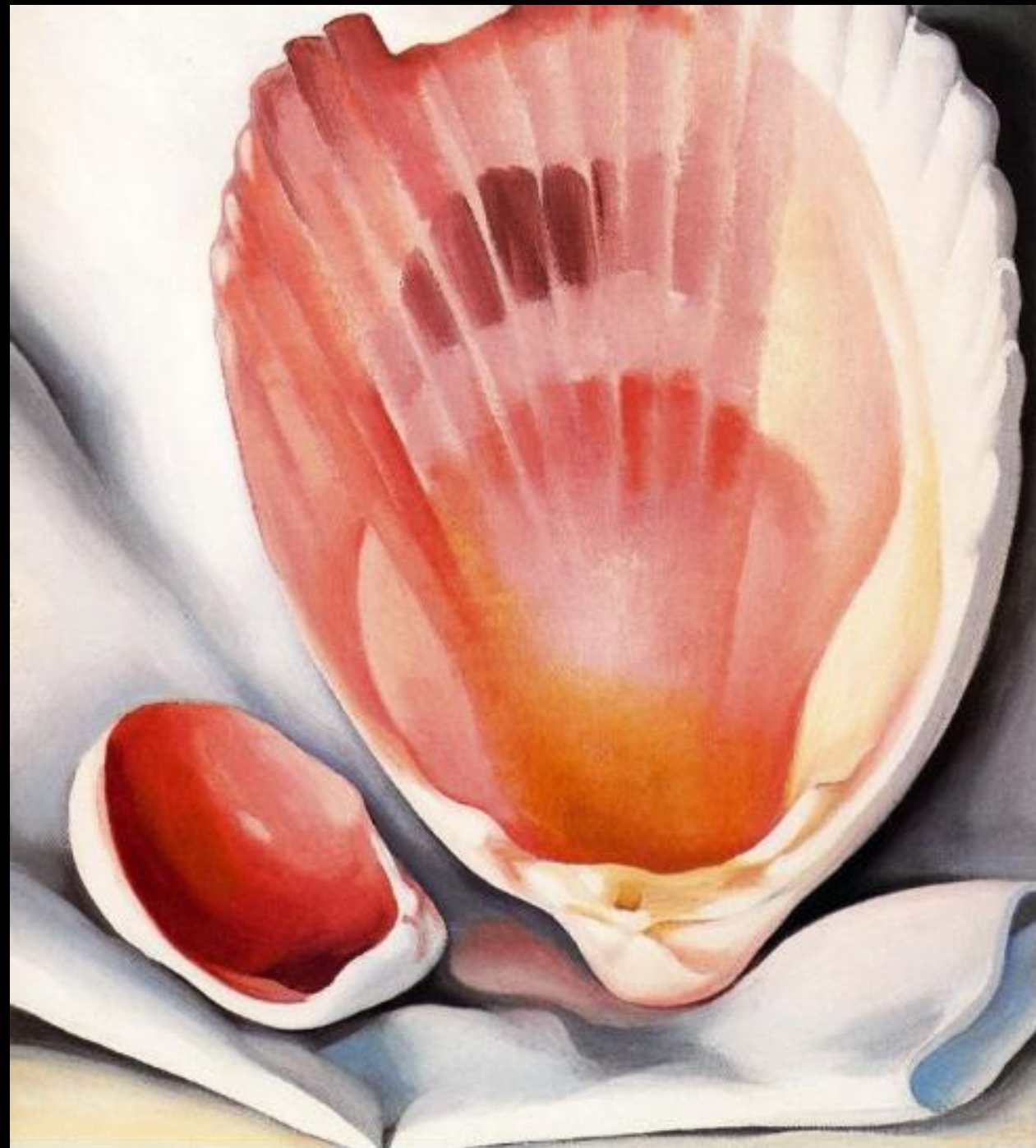

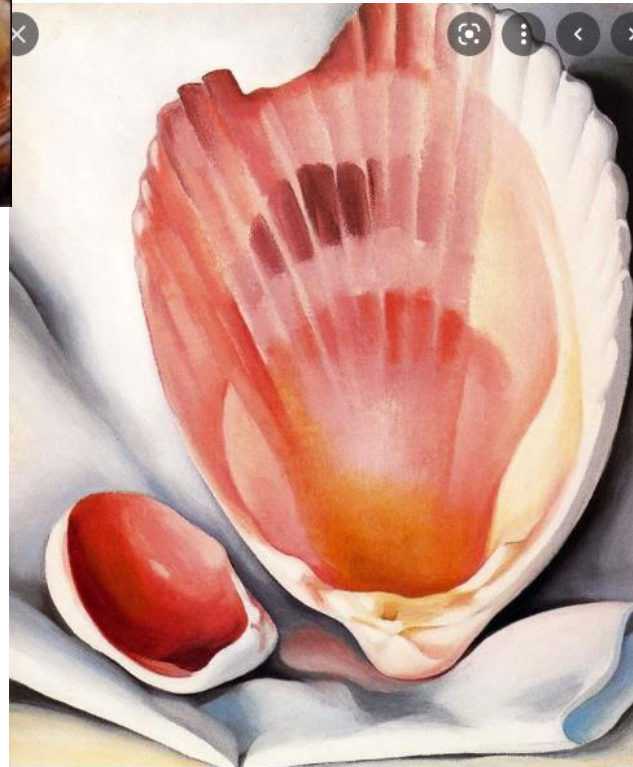

VISUAL ELEMENTS: Line, Shape, Texture, Pattern, 3-d Form, Colour, Tone, Space and Depth.

PRINCIPLES OF DESIGN: Balance, Contrast, Emphasis, Pattern, Unity, Movement, Rhythm, Repetition, Proportion, Variety.

- **Drawing** – a picture or diagram made with a pencil, pen, charcoal or chalk rather than paint. A series of marks made to create an image in pencil, pen, charcoal or chalk.
- **Express** – convey (a thought or feeling) in words, art or by gestures and conduct.
- **Communicate** – share or exchange information. (convey).
- **Fundamental** – forming a necessary base or core; of central importance.
- **Observed Drawing** – drawing from real life, studying things in the real world around you.
- **Observe or observing** - watch someone (or something) carefully and attentively.

KNOWLEDGE ORGANISER 'SEA, SEASHORE AND COAST'

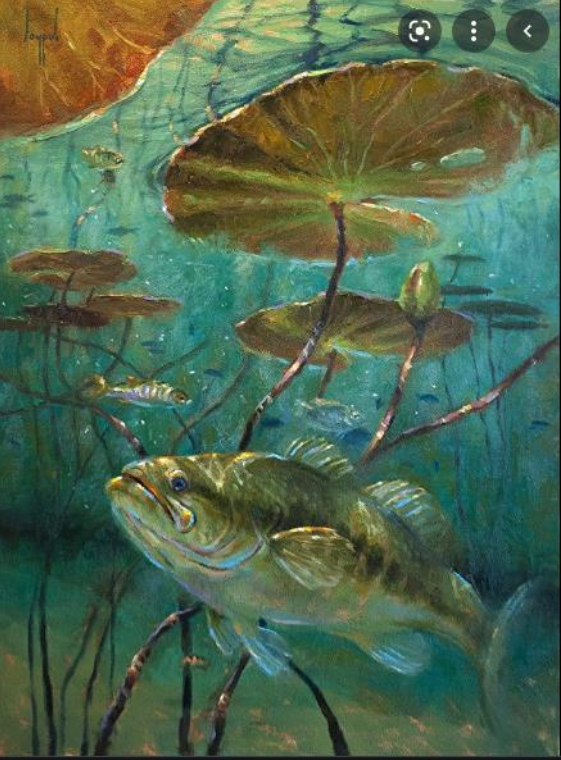
Sea: *noun* - the expanse of salt water that covers most of the earth's surface and surrounds its land masses.

Seashore: *noun* - an area of sandy, stony, or rocky land bordering and level with the sea.

Coast: *noun* - the part of the land adjoining or near the sea.



- **Research:** *noun* - investigation and study of materials and sources to understand something.
Verb – the act of investigating or researching.
- **Investigate:** *verb* - the action of investigating something or someone; formal or systematic examination or research
- **Observe:** notice or perceive (something) and register it as being significant.
- **Explore ideas:** *verb*. If you explore an idea or suggestion, you think about or comment on it in detail, so you can assess it carefully.
- **Experiment:** *noun* - to do something to find something out.
Verb - to try out a new process, technique, material or idea.
- **Develop:** *verb* - grow or cause to grow and become more complex, advanced, or elaborate.
- **Modify:** *verb* – make partial or minor changes to something.
- **Refine:** *verb* - make minor changes to improve something.
- **Realisation of ideas:** the creation of the final piece for a project.

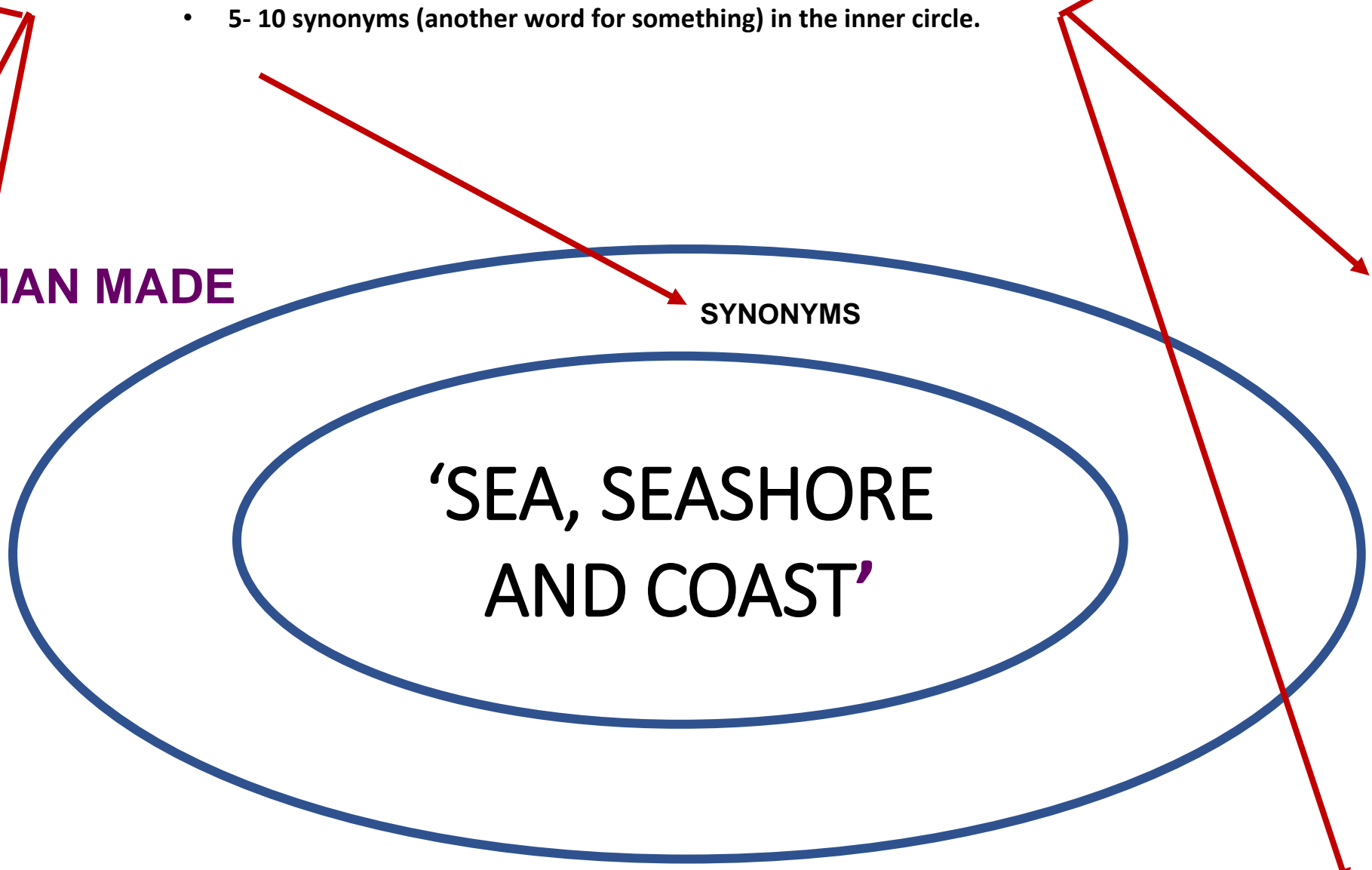

NATURAL WORLD



THESAURUS – a book full of words that mean the same or similar

SYNONYMS: words which mean the same or similar.

Coast Noun: beach, border, coastline, littoral, seaboard, seaside, shore, strand

Verb: cruise, drift, freewheel, get by, glide, sail, taxi

SEA: Noun: main, ocean, the briny, the deep, the drink, the waves

Figurative: abundance, expanse, mass, multitude, plethora, profusion, sheet, vast number.

Adjective: At sea, adrift, astray, at a loss, at sixes and sevens, baffled, bewildered, confused, disorientated, lost, mystified, puzzled, upset,

Aquatic, briny, marine, maritime, ocean, ocean-going, oceanic, pelagic, salt, saltwater, seagoing

SHORE: Noun: Beach, coast, foreshore, lakeside, sands, seaboard, seashore, strand, waterside.

DICTIONARY –meanings of words.

Coast 1. the place where the land meets the sea; seaside.

Sea 1. The mass of salt water that covers $\frac{3}{4}$'s of the earth's surface.
3. turbulence or swell.

Shore 1. the land along the edge of the sea, lake or wide river.
